



2007 SUMMER SESSION APPLICATION INFORMATION SHEET

Deadline: April 20, 2007

Read the following information carefully, then complete and return the 2007 Summer Session Financial Aid Application. By signing the application, you acknowledge that you have read and understood the information below. Retain this information sheet for your records.

Deadlines

- March 30, 2007 You must have filed a 2006-2007 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by this date in order to receive Summer Session financial aid.
- April 20, 2007 You must submit the Summer Session Application for Financial Aid to the Financial Aid Office by this date.
- April 20, 2007 You must have submitted all required documents to the Financial Aid Office by this date to be awarded financial aid for summer 2007.
- June 6, 2007 Last day to submit a loan request form for Summer Session I
- July 11, 2007 Last day to submit a loan request form for Summer Sessions I and II

Eligibility Requirements for Summer Session

In order to be eligible for Summer Session financial aid, you must:

- Be enrolled at least half time. This applies to most types of aid. See "Credit Hours and Your Award."
- Be admitted to or enrolled in a degree or eligible certificate program at UNCG. Visiting and Express students are not eligible to receive financial aid.
- Meet the requirements of the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for Financial Aid at the end of the Spring 2007 term (see Page 2 for details).
- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen.
- Not be in default on a loan or owe a refund on a federal grant at any institution.
- If required, be registered with Selective Service.
- Provide all requested documentation.

Credit Hours and Your Award

Once financial aid has been awarded for Summer Session, there can be no adjustments to your original award.

Carefully consider your requested loan amount. **You will be held to the hours you indicate on your Summer Session Application for Financial Aid.** You must be registered for all summer courses by the start of Summer Session I. If you fail to register for the reported hours, by the beginning of Summer Session I, your aid will be canceled.

Summer Session Enrollment Requirements for Undergraduate Students

Full time	12 or more credit hours
Three-quarter time	9 to 11 credit hours
Half time	6 to 8 credit hours
Less than half time	5 credit hours or below

Summer Session Enrollment Requirements for Graduate Students

Full time	6 or more credit hours
Half time	3 to 5 credit hours

Graduate students receiving financial aid are required to earn a minimum of 3 credit hours at the 500 level or above. The Financial Aid Office cannot provide funding for assistantship hours or 800 level graduate courses that have no credit attached.

Access to Financial Aid Funds

Disbursement dates depend on the number of sessions in which you are enrolled, the number of credit hours for which you enroll each session, and the type of financial aid you are awarded. No financial aid will be disbursed until Summer Session classes begin.

Under certain circumstances, you may be awarded aid for the Summer term but not be able to receive any funds until the beginning of Summer Session II. Please refer to "Types of Aid Available" for important details regarding disbursement of funds.

Types of Aid Available

Grants and scholarships generally are not available for Summer Session. Financial assistance for summer usually consists of Federal Family Education Loan Program funds (Stafford and PLUS Loans).

Federal Family Education Loan Program (Stafford Loans and PLUS Loans)

Not all students will be able to borrow Stafford Loans during the summer. Stafford Loans are limited to an academic year maximum and the Summer term is part of the current (2006-2007) academic year. The Financial Aid Office will inform you of your eligibility. You must be enrolled at least half time (see enrollment requirements listed on previous page) in order to borrow Stafford and PLUS Loans.

The number of sessions and credit hours for which you enroll will determine when you have access to loan funds. During Summer Session I, you must be enrolled in at least 6 hours as an undergraduate student or 3 hours as a graduate student in order to receive loan funds at the beginning of the first session.

Summer Session I only: You will receive your loan disbursement at the start of Session I provided that your lender has sent the funds to UNCG and that you are registered at least half time.

Summer Session II only: You will receive your loan disbursement at the start of Session II provided that your lender has sent the funds to UNCG and you are registered at least half-time.

Summer Sessions I and II: If you will be enrolled less than half time for the first session, you will not have access to your loan funds until the beginning of Summer Session II. Your hours for both sessions combined must equal at least half-time status.

Federal Pell Grants, Federal Perkins Loans, and Federal Work-Study

Most students will have already received their maximum Pell Grant during the Fall and Spring semesters. The Financial Aid Office will determine if you have any remaining Pell Grant eligibility. You do not have to be enrolled at least half time to receive a Federal Pell Grant, but you must meet other eligibility requirements.

Perkins Loan and Federal Work-Study funds are subject to availability. You must be enrolled at least half time and meet other eligibility requirements in order to receive a Perkins Loan.

If you are eligible to receive Pell and Perkins funds and you will be attending Session I only, you will receive these funds at the beginning of Session I. If you are receiving Pell and Perkins funds and will be attending Session II only you will receive these funds at the beginning of Summer Session II. ***Until your funds are disbursed, you will be responsible for paying all***

expenses (such as books, rent, living expenses) other than those directly billed to you by UNCG.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy and Summer Session

Students who are not meeting the Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for Financial Aid Eligibility at the end of the Spring 2007 term are not eligible to receive 2007 Summer Session or 2007-2008 financial aid at UNCG.

You may regain financial aid eligibility by:

- Making up credit hours during Summer Session without receiving financial aid. **If you are attending Summer Session in order to make up hours failed or dropped during the academic year, you should not complete the Summer Session Application for Financial Aid.** Once you have successfully completed the hours you are making up, you must notify the Financial Aid Office so that your eligibility can be reviewed for reinstatement.
- Appealing your eligibility. If you believe that extenuating circumstances caused you to lose your financial aid eligibility, you may appeal and explain those circumstances. To receive aid for the 2007 Summer Session, you should appeal between March 1, 2007 and April 20, 2007. Your appeal must be approved before Summer Session aid can be awarded.

The Financial Aid Office also reviews your academic progress during the summer. Your Summer Session financial aid will be based on your enrollment status (full time, half time, etc.) as indicated on your Summer Session Application for Financial Aid.

If you receive financial aid and fail, receive an incomplete, or drop one of your summer classes, you may not be meeting the SAP Policy for financial aid and your Fall 2007 aid may be cancelled. As a result, you may be responsible for paying all of your Fall tuition and fees without the assistance of financial aid.

Both graduate and undergraduate students must earn 75% of the minimum credit hours for their Summer Session course load in order to remain eligible for UNCG financial aid at during 2007-2008. Graduate students must also maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or better. The Satisfactory Academic Progress Policy for Financial Aid is available in the Financial Aid Office and can be found in The UNCG Financial Aid Handbook.

- ✓ Graduate students are required to earn a minimum of 3 credit hours at the 500 level or above and maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or better.
- ✓ You must earn 75% of the number of hours that you indicate below.
- ✓ The number of sessions and number of credit hours for which you enroll will determine when you have access to any financial aid funds. See the Summer Session Application Information Sheet for details.
- ✓ You must be registered for all of your Summer Session classes by the beginning of the first session.
- ✓ Once financial aid has been awarded for Summer Session, there can be no adjustments to your original award.
- ✓ **Your award will be cancelled if you fail to register for the reported hours indicated below.**
